### **As Scientists:**

Earth and Space will be a major focus for us. We will: identify the different objects in our solar system, consider how the Earth and Moon interact and learn about the other planets. We will also examine star constellations and learn to identify some from their shapes. We are going on a trip to the Norman Lockyer Observatory on 7th February!

#### As Mathematicians we will:

Continue to concentrate on foundation skills including: times tables, mental methods for calculation and strategies to make our Maths quicker and more accurate.

We will study: Multiplication and Division, Fractions, Decimals. Early Algebra and Ratio

This term we will introduce stem sentences and focus more on Mathematical language.

We also plan to introduce a weekly problem solving session.

## As Athletes we will:

With Mr Goode the children will practise balance, transition and use Gymnastics equipment. On Fridays we will use Dance to tell stories.

# **As Linguists:**

In the second half of term, we will learn more French around the topic of 'Hobbies and Holidays'.

# As Citizens we will: (PSHE)

Look forward to being older and examine economic well-being. The other unit we will cover is called 'getting on and falling out'.



# As Artists/Designers we will:

Improve our observational drawing and apply it to self portraits. We will also explore the application of colour taking Van Gogh as our inspiration.

In Design and Technology we will make models of moon buggies and examine the operation of axles and wheels.

# As Geographers/Historians we will:

Concentrate on Physical Geography. We will study the world around Us – including the equator, northern & southern hemispheres, the Arctic & Antarctic and time zones.

Later in the term we will study The Iron Age in History.

#### As Readers and Writers we will:

Explore Myth and Legend, starting with the beautiful illustrated text: The Ice Bear. We will also look at A Drove of Bullocks and work with non-fiction books that will support our Geography.

I would like the children to bring their reading books to school every day and record their efforts, on Fridays I will collect the Reading Records and monitor their progress. We will be doing a weekly guided session using wonderful new texts kindly donated by the PTFA. We are blessed with a lovely library that has a fantastic selection within!

# **As Musicians:**

We will learn how to play a simple scale of notes on the recorder and perform some tunes.

# In RE we will:

Explore the religion of Hinduism. This is a chance to broaden our understanding of how different people around the world live as well as what it means to be a British Hindu.

# Computing:

The children each have their own laptop for use in class that we use across the curriculum. This term we will focus on effective research skills as well as recording and editing sound and video.
