

The Grammarsaurus art curriculum encompasses a diverse selection of artists. Some are studied in depth, whilst others are encountered more briefly. This allows for a large range of artists to be showcased. The artists selected are both traditionally acclaimed and contemporary artists from across the globe.

The students will revisit the work of many artists across year groups and units. These include some of the works of Tariku Shiferaw, Mr Doodle, Oscar Ukonu, Christa Rijnveld, Dapo Adeola, and Nora Sherwood. The curriculum further exposes learners to various disciplines, such as the disabled artist Sarah Biffin, who created miniatures for royalty, a contemporary photographer from Benin, and ceramists Kate Malone and Vanessa Hodge. The students will study pottery from throughout history as well as from the modern day. They also meet artists involved in sustainability, such as architect Kathryn Larsen and digital artist Je Hong. More traditional artists such as Vincent van Gogh and William Morris also feature.

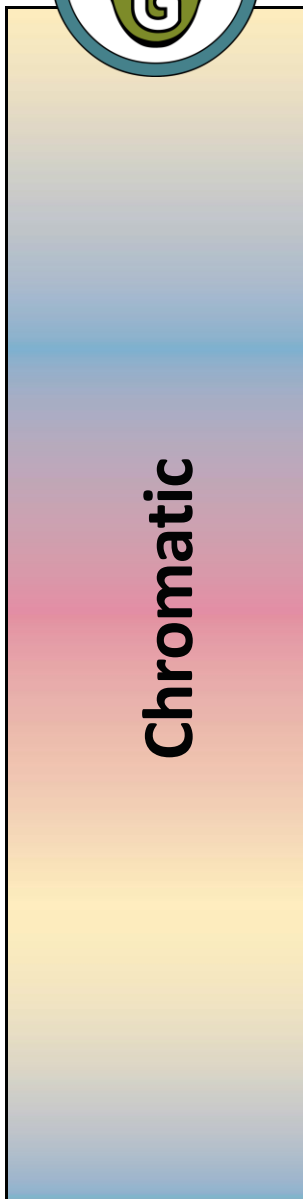
